

"Look at the birds of the air, they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" - Matthew 6:26

The world certainly gives us plenty to worry about, from our bodies to our households to our country and beyond. If we're not careful, we can let these sources of worry control us, blocking our view of God's presence and work in this world.

The opposite of worry is imagination.
