

A WORD FROM KORY



Jimmy Carter was the first president I remember. I turned six just before he took office in January 1977 and have only vague memories of his time in the Oval Office, since I wasn't reading the Wall Street Journal yet or listening to NPR podcasts. In fact, my most vivid memory of Carter's presidency was "Billy Beer," the beverage promoted by the president

dent's brother.

Most historians agree that Carter wasn't very successful as the president. In fact, some call him quite disappointing and say that one of the main causes of his lack of success was his commitment to the American people to always tell the truth. During his four years as president, his approval rating plummeted from 75 percent to 28 percent, yet he was always considered an honest and decent man. His reputation for honesty made it harder for him to get things done in Washington. I'll let you draw your own conclusion about the state of politics today, but it hurts my heart to think the only way you can really be successful is if you jettison any hopes of being honest.

As we all know, Carter's greater success happened after he lost his bid for re-election. When he lost to Ronald Reagan, he was 56 years old, at the time the youngest living ex-president. When he died, he was 100, the oldest living president. In the 44 years in between, Carter set the example for what a servant leader looks like. Many politicians, once they leave office, focus on building their "brand," going on speaking tours, commanding exorbitant fees, maintaining their public status. Carter didn't build a brand; instead, he and his wife, Rosalyn, built houses.

Carter's post-presidential life is an exemplary lesson in how to deal with failure. Can you imagine how it must feel to lose on such a national stage? And Carter didn't just lose. He was trounced, gaining only 49 electoral votes to Reagan's 489. No claims of election fraud in 1980! With a beating like that, it would have made sense for Carter to slink back into private life, not doing anything to draw attention or remind people of his lackluster presidency.

How do you handle failure? I'm not so great with it. I don't like to fail, because it feels like a statement about my worth as a person. If I try something and don't succeed, all the voices come out of the woodwork, telling me I'm not good enough, I should never have tried in the first place. I remember the first few times I tried to ride a bike, not only did I fall off, but one time it was into a giant mud puddle! The last

thing I wanted to do was get back on that bike. But eventually, I did (after a shower!).

What I love about Carter's legacy is that, at 56 years old, instead of wallowing in what could have been, he focused on what could be. He asked himself the question, "What good work can I do with the rest of my life?", and he answered that question each and every day, right up until the end. Jimmy Carter did a lot of good work in his last 44 years.

How about us? I have no idea how much time I have left - I hope it's a LOT! - but I want to use it to serve God to the fullest of my abilities. I want to do good work for the sake of God's kin-dom, helping others know they are loved and treasured by God, so much so that God would give us Jesus, God's love made flesh. So many people talk about that, but it's folks like Jimmy Carter who show it.

What will your legacy be? What will people remember? For Jimmy Carter, his legacy could have been his presidency. He could have let those four years define him for the rest of his life. We run the same risk, letting a failure or a disappointment define us. But God has so many plans for the rest of our lives! My prayer is that we look forward with our eyes open to how God will use us to swing a hammer, write a card, or pour a cup of coffee in God's name. God's not done with you yet. What good work can you do with the rest of your life?

The agency was founded in 1995 with a focus on young mothers ages 12-24. Step by Step offers support, mentoring, goal setting, and crisis intervention, as they walk alongside these young mothers and their children.

These cards will be used for the young mothers to transport children to doctor appointments.
