A WORD FROM KORY



As our country transitions in leadership, immigration is a front-and-center issue, as it was for the entire campaign. This hot-button topic is debated ad nauseum, and our new president is taking concrete action to fulfill his campaign promises not only to stop immigration, but to rid our country of anyone who is here illegally. This issue has con-

sequences at the macro-level (e.g., how it impacts our economy and our workforce) and the micro-level (real stories of individuals and families negatively impacted by the executive orders). Regardless of what you believe about this issue, there is a lot of fear-mongering and mis-information driving much of the news about actions promised and taken and the people who are in the crosshairs.

I'm reminded of the most challenging class I took in my D.Min. program. It was called "Theology and Migration - Borderlands" and was taught by Dr. Emily Askew. The focus of the class was on the theological concepts that undergird the issue of immigration. While our culture wrestles with this issue on the political, social, and economic level, like any issue, there's always a deeper spiritual aspect to consider. This is certainly true with immigration.

For the class, we read <u>The Far Away Brothers</u>, a non-fiction book about underage undocumented twins from El Salvador who migrate to the United States to try to make a life, and <u>Undocumented</u>, a look at the evolution of immigration from Mexico and how the border "moved" in order to make such action criminal. I would highly recommend both books.

We also watched several interviews and documentaries to help us understand the issue more deeply. We watched an interview with a pastor in Lodi, CA, who works with undocumented migrants to help them navigate the complex judicial system, and an interview with a transgendered Mexican migrant, who shared her harrowing story of crossing the border.

There is so much I take for granted every day. My life is so relatively easy that I can't even imagine what an immigrant must go through. Dr. Askew encouraged us to let this issue "break our hearts" so that we could enter into the pain and suffering of our brothers and sisters who have no place to call home, who must

leave in order to find peace and safety in another country.

That happened for me while watching an Amazon film called "Human Flow." The movie gives a sweeping view of migrations across the world, putting a human face on the overwhelming numbers of people displaced from their homes. Several times during the movie, the filmmaker focused on children, and I imagined my own daughters being forced to flee their homes and the lengths to which I would go to protect them. No matter what we think of the issue of immigration, it's important to realize that the people involved are first and foremost human beings, just like us, doing their best to provide for their family and keep their kids safe.

Whatever you believe about immigration, the theological point that struck home for me is that everyone deserves to be treated as a human being. Immigrants are being labeled as rapists, murders, and overall bad people. While that may be true of a small number of them, what I learned in the class is that most immigrants are simply people looking for a safe home. The Bible has a few things to say about how we are to treat "the foreigner and the immigrant." My prayer is that we can live up to that call, as people and as a country.

FEBRUARY SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE:

FEBRUARY SERVICE PROJECT: ARBOR YOUTH SERVICES

Arbor Youth Services is the only emergency shelter for unaccompanied youth under 18 in central Kentucky. It provides a supportive environment to youth who have suffered abuse or abandonment or have been victimized. Youth may request shelter themselves or they may be referred by a teacher, law enforcement personnel, counselors or other professionals. There is also an outreach program that assists those aged 18-24 who are at risk of violence or exploitation. Receiving timely intervention from Arbor Youth Services helps to place these young people on the path to safety, where they can focus on recovery, job training, and skill development for those who are older.

The following items are needed and may be placed in the Giving Lane (located in the hallway that leads to the Administrative Wing), under the sign for <u>Disciples</u> Women's Ministries:

Hygiene supplies such as deodorant or body wash Individually wrapped snacks such as granola bars New towels and washcloths
Socks and underwear (adult sizes M, L, XL, XXL)
Laundry detergent
Paper towels and toilet paper
Gift cards for grocery, fast food, and fuel
Art supplies
Non-perishable food items
Activity-based gift cards such as movie theater, Malibu Jack
Bus passes, single ride for 30 days

LOCAL OUTREACH

Crestwood has a history of generous giving in the community, and 2025 is no different. Every year the Local Outreach team makes decisions about how to use the monies allocated to us in the general operating budget. For 2025 we were allocated right at \$20,000. The agencies we selected for gifts of money are ones we have been supporting for many years. We also set aside money each month for the Blessing Box, which provides food to Crestwood's neighbors in need, and for the Bridge Fund, which allows us to help those in the community who need help with rent or utilities. Sheri Shaver and Steph Wallace work tirelessly to assess the needs of those who call in to see whether they fall within our ability to help them.

For 2025, our allocations are as follows:

- January, \$2000 to Step by Step
- February, \$3000 to Arbor Youth Services
- March, \$2000 to Natalie's Sisters
- May, \$1500 to New Life Day Center
- October, \$400 to Shop with a Cop
- December, \$1500 to Greenhouse17

Every month we allocate \$450 to the Bridge Fund (\$5400 per year) and \$350 (\$4200) to the Blessing Box.

In past years we have given money to the Lexington Rescue Mission and the Nest. In view of the \$100,000 gift from the endowment fund to the Mission in 2024, we decided we would not give a general support disbursement to them this year, and, because Crestwood supplies The Nest with \$8000 worth of food for food boxes, we have decided that will be our contribution to the agency this year.

Local Outreach is also working with DWM this year to send our contribution to a particular agency in the same month that DWM has a service project for that agency. We also hope to host leaders of each agency with which we work at Crestwood in the appropriate month, so the congregation can learn more about them.

As important as money is to each group we support, many also need hands-on volunteers. Crestwood serves a meal to Bible Study participants at the Lexington Rescue Mission on the second Wednesday of each month. We always need more people to provide food and/or to serve. Step by Step always needs people to play with the children who come with their moms on Thursday nights to their gatherings. New Life Day Center needs people to serve breakfast to the clients. There are many ways to be involved in the work that goes on in our community, to help people to flourish. I am so glad for the generous spirit at Crestwood, and I am grateful to serve with you.

BOARD NOTES

At its January meeting the Administrative Board of the church discussed several agenda items:

- Our treasurer, Annetta Carter, reported that we finished 2024 over budget in pledges by \$7,281, which included being over budget \$26,332 in the month of December. In addition to that good news, we finished the year under budget in expenses by \$47,494.
- The Faithful Planning Committee gave an update on its work, which includes preparing to gather information from the congregation, organizations supported by our Local Outreach team, and outside groups that use the Mission Center. We'll use this data to evaluate our current vision and mission and to help us put together strategic goals for the future.
- Rick Tittmann reported on behalf of the Childcare Council that the administrative separation between the Childcare Center and the church is essentially complete. While this will in no way affect the day-to-day operation of the center or the relationship between the two entities, it does give the Center more freedom and authority as it moves forward as its own legal entity.
